

How to calculate Your Grade Point Average (GPA):

- Use the table below to convert your grades into grade points.
- Then, apply these points to the GPA calculation formula.
- If your courses aren't graded using credits, substitute the total number of courses taken for the number of credits. (Round to two decimal places.)
- Enter your cumulative GPA in the Online Application.
- **Eligibility for the ISP requires a GPA of 2.10 or higher on a 3.00 scale from the previous academic year at your current university or institution.**

Formula:

$$(3 \times \text{Credits with a grade point of 3}) + (2 \times \text{Credits with a grade point of 2}) + (1 \times \text{Credits with a grade point of 1}) + (0 \times \text{Credits with a grade point of 0})$$

Total Registered Credits

1. If the previous academic year's grades are not available by the selection deadline, in principle, calculate the GPA based on the grades from the previous semester. If the previous semester's grades are also unavailable, please calculate as follows ***1~*3**:

***1** First-year undergraduate students in their first semester should submit an unofficial transcript showing the courses taken, credits earned, and grades received during the current semester.

***2** First-year master's students in their first semester should base their calculation on their final undergraduate year's grades.

***3** Students who took a leave of absence during the previous academic year should use their grades from the year before last. Students who took a leave of absence in the second semester of the previous academic year should use their grades from the first semester of the previous year.
